


WHAT IS BEING DONE IN NORTH AMERICA.




BASEMENT PLAN SCALE / 1N-1FT.

Bicycle Room. Heating Plant and Fuel Room. Lavatories.




MAIN FLOOR.

Gymnasium 75x50 feet thoroughly equipped. Physical Director's Office with private room for physical examination. Reception Room, attractive, neatly furnished and with an open fire-place. Reading Room, large and well lighted. Spa., fitted up to serve light lunches. Lecture Room, for practical talks and small meetings. Parlor, for members and their friends.

SECOND FLOOR.

Gymnasium Running Track and Visitors' Gallery. Banked Track, thirty-two laps to the mile. Boys' Rooms, accommodating three hundred boys. Equipped with things boys like. Auditorium, for Association meetings, suppers and banquets, with movable chairs and rolling partitions. Kitchen and Serving Rooms, adjacent to the auditorium. Ladies' Cloak
Room and Toilet Room.
